OGHS FBC offering will be in July

On Easter Sunday in 1949, on nation-wide radio, Christians were challenged to donate one million dollars in one hour to help people devastated by the aftermath of World War II. Faithful Christians answered the challenge and the goal was met. That was the beginning of the **One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS)** offering!

In 1973 American Baptists formally joined the movement that had been carried forward by several Protestant denominations. Giving to OGHS in 1973 was \$82,045. Over the decades since, American Baptists have increased their support for the offering and in doing so have been sharing the light in all corners of the world—at times during some of the darkest moments in human history. Providing for the myriad needs that result from famine and hunger crises, displacement of people due to war and natural disasters, and recurring and extraordinary natural disasters have been the focus of OGHS. But not just in the immediate aftermath. Today OGHS continues to provide emergency relief after disasters while at the same time supporting development work around the world that seeks to address chronic conditions that linger for years or decades longer.

I love Eugene Peterson's paraphrase of these verses in Matthew 5, and the clear commission they give to show up brightly in the world and be generous with our lives. That is the invitation extended in this year's theme, **Share the Light**. And it's an invitation that American Baptists have accepted and responded to for over 50 years. SHARING THE LIGHT FOR 75 YEARS A LETTER FROM YOUR WORLD RELIEF OFFICER "Let me tell you why you are here...You're here to be light, bringing out the God-colors in the world...Keep open house; be generous with your lives." (Matthew 5:13-16, The Message)

The scriptures tell us that huge crowds were gathering, drawn to Jesus by his teachings and the miracles of healing he performed. So Jesus climbed a hill and delivered his "sermon on the mount" to an audience captivated by his message and ways. He offered them blessings, affirming them in ways probably no one had before.

Then he described a life of discipleship characterized by prayer, humility, love of one's enemies, and a steady practice of being 'salt and light,' generously sharing the goodness of God in all the world.

One Great Hour of Sharing is a beautiful opportunity to do just that. When we participate in One Great Hour of Sharing, we become a dazzling prism of light scattering blessing in places that desperately need it. We offer hope to people forced to flee their homes in search of safety and new promise. We support life-giving recovery efforts when disasters devastate communities and lives. We empower partners in their labors to build sustainable futures. We plant seeds of peace where war has multiplied despair and destruction.

This is why we are here: to be shining witnesses of uncommon love and enduring hope and to be generous with our lives. I hope you will invite giving to the One Great Hour of Sharing offering this year with the same spirit of joyful generosity you have for so many years!

FBC Visitor July 2024 PHILIPPIANS

KEY VERSE:

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again Rejoice." (4:4)

Paul wrote Philiappians to dear friends. Wm. Barkley calls this "the loveliest letter Paul ever wrote," It has been called *The Epistle of Excellent Things* and sometimes *The Epistle of Joy.*" As we read Philippians note "Rejoice" and "Joy" recur often. He is writing to special friends. (1:1-11) Paul's greeting is informal, as to friends. (1:12-26) Paul is a prisoner in Rome. His message of Christ rapidly spread through Rome. Through his captive audience he taught the importance of a believer to **Stand firm amid persecution** (1:27-30). **Be united by Humility** (2:5-11). **Imitate Christ** (2:5-11). **Be a Light in a Dark World**. (2:12-18)

Paul illustrates his encouragement through metaphors as in 1. 1 Corinthians (9:24-27) 2. he speaks of training for a race. 3. Philippians (3:13,14) focus on winning. 4. 1 Timothy (4:7-10) training, & spiritual exercise to grow in faith and character.
