"What's in a Name?"

What is the significance of a name? When we hear someone is expecting a child, we excitedly ask, "Have you chosen a name yet?" There's something about a name. In "The Crucible," when character John Proctor refuses to sign a document confessing to witchcraft he says, "How may I live without my name? I have given you my soul; leave me my name." And in the classic "Les Miserables," the persistence of now freed prisoner "24601" to insist upon his name, Jean Valjean, drives the story through Valjean's pursuit of freedom and inspector Javier's pursuit of "24601."

In the time of Jesus, the naming of children was powerful and symbolic and of course some Christian traditions celebrate "Holy Name," the act of dedicating and naming Jesus. Additionally, we have the significance of renaming. Abram and Sarai are Abraham and Sarah following the covenant call in Genesis 12. Jacob wrestles with God, has twelve sons and is renamed Israel. Saul of Tarsus is renamed Paul after the Damascus road encounter with Jesus and the call to the Gentiles. And Christians frequently refer to the many names, references to Jesus such as Savior, Lord, Messiah, Redeemer, Lamb of God, Son of man, Son of God, Liberator, Alpha and Omega and many, many more.

I became fascinated with the power and effect names recently upon encountering a new dynamic translation of the New Testament. Seeking to encourage deep understanding of the story of Jesus among native, first nation persons, a number of native persons developed the "First Nations Version: An Indigenous Translation of the New Testament." As soon as I started reading it, I was deeply moved by the power of names as the biblical characters each are "named." Following are excerpts from John 1.

Long again the time before all days, before the creation of all things, the one who is known as the Word was there face to face with the Great Spirit. This Word fully represents Creator and shows us who he is and what he is like. He has always been there from the beginning, for the Word and the Creator are one and the same. (John 1:1-3)

Into the wilderness of the Land of Promise (Judea) came a man named Gift of Goodwill (John). He was sent by the Great Spirit to tell what he knew about the Light so everyone could believe.(John 1:6-7)

Creator's Word became a flesh and blood human being and pitched his sacred tent among us, living as one of us.(John 1:14)

From the fullness of his being we have all had many gifts of kindness poured out on us. Drawn from Water (Moses) gave us our tribal laws, but the gift of great kindness and truth came from Creator Sets Free (Jesus), the Chosen One.(John 1:16-17) Oh my, the beauty of seeing truth through names. Jesus being referenced as Creator Sets Free moves me to tears and Jesus' mother Mary being named "Bitter Tears" brings tears of a different kind. May we always be moved to tender tears by the name above all names and sing the song of "there's something about that name," Creator Sets Free, Jesus.

Oh, there is indeed something about that name!



ABWM OCTOBER BOM Ecclesiastes

When you rise each morning does your daily agenda come to mind immediately? Do you make a "to-do-list" for your day? How often is that list completed?

Suppose you STOP, begin your day with a prayer, God will provide whatever is needed to those who ask for it with FAITH. Matthew 7:7. What a novel idea.

The author of *Proverbs, Songs of Songs and Ecclesiastes* was King David's son Solomon. Solomon was a smart kid, most unusual. When his dad died he became King. God favored Solomon by offering him anything he desired. Solomon chose wisdom. God granted his wish. He was so wise Kings and Queens from other nations came to have conversations with him. God also showered him with riches beyond our imagination.

Some say Solomon wrote this book in Greek and/or Latin (ekklesiastes) meaning "preacher' Or "assembly" or "congregation". In the NT the word *ekklesia means "one who calls or gathers"*. The one who addresses the assembly is "the Preacher".

Solomon's first task was rebuilding the temple for the Lord, in Jerusalem. It was magnificent.

His father, David, had a "heart for God". God loved him dearly. When he sinned he repented and God forgave. But as Solomon grew older he became cynical, discouraged everything has no purpose, "meaningless everything is meaningless".

"For with much wisdom comes sorrow; the more knowledge, the more grief." [ch.1:18].

Solomon's heart was not with God, he became distracted and strayed, his love and devotion to God took a "back seat" while pursuing "hobbies". We must learn from Solomon's mistakes. Do not get discouraged with all that vanity, vanity and meaningless talk. There is Hope. "Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter."

"Fear God and keep his commandments.

For this is the whole duty of man. For God will bring every deed into judgment including every hidden thing.

International Ministries

International Ministries has sent an initial grant of \$20,000 in One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) emergency relief to partners that will provide humanitarian relief to the victims of the severe flooding devastating northern Thailand.

Catastrophic flooding has struck Chiang Rai province in northern Thailand, affecting more than 10,000 homes, according to news reports from the Bangkok Post. Some are calling it the worst flooding in 80 years, with the Kok River overflowing to submerge the entire business district of Chiang Rai city. Across Thailand, 48 provinces remain under flash flood warnings through September 18th, with the potential for further devastation.

International Ministries (IM) is deeply concerned for the safety and well-being of its global servants and partners in the region. The Williams and Coats families,

IM global servants stationed in Chiang Rai, have been forced to flee their homes due to rising floodwaters.

IM Area Director for Southeast Asia and Japan Rev. Kyle Witmer describes the dire situation: "Our partners among the hill tribe peoples here have seen some devastating realities as rivers have overrun their banks on numerous occasions. Please prayerfully consider how God might use you to respond with love and care for those affected. Pray that in the midst of this difficult time, people will see the difference that a relationship with Jesus Christ makes in the lives of God's children."

With ongoing flood warnings, immediate needs for displaced families include food, clean water, and shelter, while longer-term efforts will focus on restoration and rebuilding. Kyle and Katrina Williams, IM global servants in Chiang Rai, have been providing updates on the situation as it unfolds. They are urgently asking for prayer and support. "Our community is overwhelmed. Many families are now living like refugees, uncertain of when they'll be able to return to their homes and begin the daunting task of clean-up," shared Kyle Williams.

IM calls for urgent prayer and support for all affected by the floods, especially for the families of its global servants and local partners.
